


PART EIGHT: GENERAL CONCLUSION

2629. This present Trial Brief is very long and detailed. We have tried to canvas every issue that may help the Trial Chamber in its deliberations on the matter of the guilt or innocence of Major Aloys Ntabakuze. We need not belabour the points that have already been made at great length *supra*. We have, it is submitted, clearly demonstrated that reasonable doubt persists for every accusation against Major Ntabakuze. It is submitted, that we have, in fact, not only raised a reasonable doubt, but have, in many instances positively proven the innocence of Major Ntabakuze on the preponderance of the evidence, including reliance on some Prosecution evidence, matters not in dispute, and the positive Defence case made with the Defence evidence.

Consequently, this Chamber is respectfully prayed to

ACQUIT Major Aloys Ntabakuze of all charges against him,
and to release him from custody.
