Dear Colonel Sagatwa,

Following our telephone conversation several days ago, I reviewed the stories published by the Press after our press conference.

For linguistic reasons, it is obvious that in Rwanda only the French-written press and Libre Belgique in particular are carefully read. I believe that the story put out by "la gazet van Antwerpen" of which I attach a copy does fairly portray the spirit of our statements. I have translated some excerpts, which do reflect our carefulness.

In the meantime believe that it is in the interest of one and all that a serious international inquiry be mounted as soon as possible. Before that, the discrete inquiry promised to the Head of State by Senator Kuipers should have accomplished its work; I have reminded the Senator of his promise and he told me that he would contact two persons who would be at the disposal of the Head of State.
