1. BEGIN_SUMMARY. BEN YAHIA'S MEETING WITH A/S MOOSE ON SEPTEMBER 25 CENTERED ON THE DIFFICULTIES ENCOUNTERED IN DEPLOYING EQUIPMENT AND TROOPS TO RVANDA,

EXPANSION/EXTENSION OF DAU OBSERVERS IN BURUNDI, MERGER OF THE BOSMIAN/RWANDAN GENOCIDE TRIBUNALS, AND MILITARY ACTIVITIES IN ANGOLA. BOTH AGREED THAT DEPLOYMENT OF EQUIPMENT AND TROOPS TO RWANDA MUST OCCUR QUICKLY IN ORDER TO MAXIMIZE THE PEACEKEEPING OPERATION'S EFFECTIVENESS AND MINIMIZE LOSS OF LIFE. MOOSE OFFERED TO INCREASE USG FIMANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE OAU IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF OAU OBSERVERS IN BURUNDI-BEN YAHTA TOLD HOUSE THAT THE DAY HAD BEEN ASKED TO PROVIDE JUDGES FOR THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL ON RWANDA. BEN YAHIA ASKED FOP USG ASSESSMENT ON THE CURRENT SITUATION IN ANGOLA. END SUMMARY.

CHAIRING THE DAU WOULD NOT BE AN EASY JOB. BEN YAHIA

ASKED MOOSE TO CONVEY TUNISIA S READINESS TO BE A SOLID PARTNER IN CONFLICT RESOLUTION IN AFRICA.

2. RWANDA PREPARATIONS UNDERWAY, BUT EQUIPMENT LACKING: HE TOLD MOOSE THAT HE HAD BEEN IN TOUCH WITH GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER KLAUS KINKEL AND BELGIAN FOREIGN MINISTER WILLY CLAES TO APPEAL FOR EU'S SUPPORT FOR THE DEPLOYMENT OF AFRICAN TROOPS INTO RWANDA BEFORE THE DEPARTURE OF OPERATION TURQUOISE TROOPS. ACCORDING TO BEN VANIA, TROOPS FROM GHANA, BENIN, AND THE CARIBBEAN ARE THERE BUT "WERE ON A THIN EDGE" BECAUSE THEY LACKED BASIC EQUIPMENT. BEN YAHLA SAID THAT A CONTINGENT OF 1, 888 TUPISIANS WERE AT THE AIRPORT AND READY AND ABLE TO GO.

3. MISCOMMUNICATIONS DELAY DEPLOYMENT: MODSE ASKED WHY THE UN HAD NOT MOVED THE TUNISIAN TROOPS IN SOONER. BEN VAHIA SAID HE HAD BEEN TOLD THAT THE DELIVERY OF APC'S FROM GERMANY HAD BEEN DELAYED, AND THAT U.S. C-1385 NEEDED

TO TRANSPORT THE TUNISIANS HAD BEEN DIVERTED FOR

STATE 262831 281913Z 8584 881938 OPERATIONS IN HAITI. VITHOUT EQUIPMENT SUPPORT, THE UN DID NOT WANT TO SEND IF THE TROOPS. HOOSE RESPONDED THAT THE USG HAD BEEN READY TO HOVE ON THE APC'S FROM SERMANY, BUT UNAMIR HAD CHANGED ITS MIND BECAUSE THE APC'S ARE TRACK VEHICLES AND MOVING THEM INTO RVANDA WOULD DAMAGE THE ROADS. THE RESULTING DELAY IN DEPLOYMENT COULD JEOPARDIZE THE AVAILABILITY OF THE EQUIPMENT GIVEN CURRENT NEEDS FOR HAITI. MOOSE AGREED THAT THE "MISCOMMUNICATION" HAD TO BE RESOLVED URGENTLY BEN YAHIA TOLD MOOSE THAT A MORE "TRANSPARENT" PICTURE, I.E., BETTER COORDINATION, WAS NECESSARY.

4. RAPID DEPLOYMENT IS CRITICAL: BEN YAH'A SAID THAT HE HAD TALKED WITH THE SECRETARIAT ABOUT THE PROBLEMS IN KIGALI. MOOSE ADDED THAT THE SLOWER THE ARRIVAL OF THE TROOPS, THE RISKIER THE UN OPERATION WOULD BE. BEN YANDES SAID THAT HIS AFRICAN CONTRACTOR WERE BEGINNING TO RETHINK THEIP PARTICIPATION HE ADDED THAT THIS I FMT URGENCY TO THE DEPLOYMENT!

BEN YAHIA ADDED THAT HE WAS A GOING TO TALK TO BOUTROS GHAL!

5. MORE DAU OBSERVERS IN BYRUNDI: MOOSE EXPRESSED USG APPRECIATION OF GOT LEADERSHIP IN CONFLICT RESOLUTION AND PEACEKEEPING AND SUGGESTED MORE ATTENTION BE FOCUSED ON & THE SITUATION IN BURUNDI. MOOSE ASKED ABOUT THE STATUS

EFFORTS TO EXPAND THE CURRENT 47 OBSERVERS TO COVER ALL MILITARY SECTORS IN ORDER TO INCREASE PUBLIC CONFIDENCE. MOOSE SAID THAT THE USE WAS PREPARED TO INCREASE ITS

CONTRIBUTION FOR DAU MONITORS ALREADY IN PLACE.

- 6. TRAINING FOR AND EXTENSION OF OAU OBSERVERS: BEN YAHIA TOLD MOOSE THAT THE DAU WAS ALSO LOOKING INTO ADDITIONAL TRAINING FOR THE MONITORS HE ADDED THAT BOUTROS GHALT HAD AGREED TO EXTEND THE DAU OBSERVERS' TIME, EVEN THOUGH SALIM HAD QUESTIONED THE EXTENSION BECAUSE OF ITS IMPACT ON LIMITED RESOURCES. BEN YAHIA TOLD MOOSE THAT DAY PRESENCE, HOWEVER SMALL, HAS CONTAIN THE CONFLICT. HE ADDED THAT THE TUNISIAN TEAM LEADERS HAD BEEN REPLACED BY SOLDIERS WHO HAD TRAINED IN CAMBODIA. BEN VANIA SAID THAT WITH A NEW PRESIDENT AND THE REFUGEES EXERTING GREATER PRESSURE, THERE WERE MULTIPLIER EFFECTS THE SOLDIERS COULD NOT COPE WITH.
- 7. INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL: HOOSE TOLD BEN YAHIA THAT JUDGE GOLDSTONE BELIEVED THAT MERGING OF THE RWANDAN TRIALS WITH THE BOSN'AM TRIALS COULD BE EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT, AND THAT A DRAFT RESOLUTION HAD ALREADY BEEN CIRCULATED. HE ADDED THAT THE US HAD HOPED THAT A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE COMMISSION OF EXPERTS WOULD BE MADE SOON. BEN YAHIA RESPONDED THAT THERE WAS A NEED FOR JUDGES, LAWYERS, AND OFFICE EQUIPMENT. HE ADDED THAT TUNISIA HAD BEEN ASKED TO PROVIDE SOME JUDGES FOR THE TRIBUNAL.
- 8. FOCUS ON RWANDA: MOOSE TOLD BEN YAHIA THAT KEEPING

THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY'S ATTENTION FOCUSED ON RWANDA REQUIRED CONTINUING EFFORTS. WITHOUT WHICH THE RISK OF FURTHER VIOLENCE AND INSTABILITY WOULD GROW AND THE IMPLICATIONS WOULD BE COSTLY.

9. PECOGNITION OF NEW GOVERNMENT IN RIGAL': BEN YAHIA TOLD MOOSE THAT SOME AFRICAN COUNTRIES HAD INITIALLY QUESTIONED THE LEGITIMACY OF THE NEW GOVERNMENT AND ITS POLICIES, BUT THAT THE NEW LEADERS IN HIGHE HAD BEEN GENERALLY ACCEPTED BY THE INTERPATIONAL COMMUNITY MOOSE
