SUMMARY

We have received instructions to be supportive of the French initiative to lead a multinational intervention in Rwanda. You conveyed that support yesterday. The French will want to press for a vote this evening on the resolution authorizing the intervention. We have several changes to the operative paragraphs, which are set out on the attached page, which you can hand out to the Council president and members.

These amendments were faxed to the French mission at 1 pm.

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Suggested Amendments to French text

- Op. 3 Acting under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, authorizes the Secretary-General and Member States cooperating to implement for a transitional period not to exceed sixty days the offer referred to in paragraph 2 above to use all necessary means to achieve the objectives set forth in paragraph 4 (a) of resolution 925 (1994);
- Op. 4 Decides that the mission of Member States cooperating with the Secretary-General will be limited to the sixty day transitional period provided that this transitional period can be terminated earlier upon determination by the Secretary-General that expanded UNAMIR is able to carry out its mandate;
- Op. 5 Calls upon the Secretary-General to identify and coordinate the supply of the essential equipment required by troops committed to expanded UNAMIR and calls upon all Member States to respond urgently to the Secretary-General's request in order to enable expanded UNAMIR to fulfil its mandate effectively as soon as possible;
- 5 bis Welcomes, in this light, the offer of the United States to consider support on a reimbursable basis to make arrangements to provide the hardware, sustainment, and training for the mission-essential equipment for the Ghanaian battalion and calls on other members of the international community to likewise sponsor specific troops contributors to speed UNAMIR's expanded force deployment;
- 7 bis Calls upon all Member States which are in a position to do so to provide military forces and to make additional contributions, in cash or in kind, in accordance with paragraph 2 above;
- op. 8 Requests the Secretary-General and, as appropriate, the States concerned to report to the Council on a regular basis, the first such report to be made no later than fifteen days after the adoption of this resolution, on the implementation of this resolution and the progress made towards the fulfilment of the objectives referred to in paragraphs 2 and 3 above, as well as another report to be made by August 12 on the progress made towards completed deployment of expanded UNAMIR;

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
