THIS PAGE-ONE LEAD STORY, UNDER THE HEADLINE "CLINTON SUPPORTS DAR ON RWANDA," WAS ESSENTIALLY A RE-WORKING OF THE JOINT STATEMENT RELEASED FOLLOWING A/S SHATTUCK'S MEETING WITH PRIME MINISTER MALECELA. BEGIN EXCERPTS: PRESIDENT CLINTON HAS EXPRESSED DEEP APPRECIATION TO TANZANIA FOR THE IMPORTANT ROLE IT HAS PLAYED IN TRYING TO BRING PEACE TO RWANDA, AND PROVIDE SHELTER TO RWANDAN REFUGEES.

THE U.S. PRESIDENT EXTENDED THE APPRECIATION THROUGH HIS PERSONAL ENVOY, ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS AND HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS JOHN SHATTUCK, WHO CALLED ON THE PRIME MINISTER AND FIRST VICE-PRESIDENT JOHN MALECELA AT HIS RESIDENCE HERE YESTERDAY.

IN THEIR DISCUSSION, THE PRIME MINISTER THANKED THE UNITED STATES FOR ITS ROLE IN PROVIDING HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE AND IN RAISING ITS VOICE AGAINST THE KILLING, DISPLACEMENT OF PEOPLE AND VIOLATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN WAR-TORN RWANDA.

WAS A NEED FOR CEASEFIRE IN RWANDA AND AN END TO THE SENSELESS KILLING AND MASSACRE OF INNOCENT CIVILIANS.

THEY ALSO SAID THE COMMANDER OF THE UN PEACEKEEPING FORCES SHOULD CONVENE A MEETING IN KIGALI OF HIGH RANKING MILITARY OFFICERS OF BOTH WARRING PARTIES TO DISCUSS CEASEFIRE.

THE PRIME MINISTER AND THE U.S. DELEGATION ALSO AGREED THAT ONCE CEASEFIRE WAS AGREED ON, AN EXPANDED INTERNATIONAL PRESENCE WOULD BE IMMEDIATELY DEPLOYED TO AID IN ITS MONITORING CEASEFIRE. THE MOVE WOULD ALSO FACILITATE PROVISION OF ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION OF THE CIVILIANS....

IT WAS ALSO INSISTED THAT ONCE CEASEFIRE WAS IN PLACE, THE ARUSHA PROCESS MUST BE RELAUCHED TO ENABLE THE TWO WARRING PARTIES TO DISCUSS IMPLEMENTATION OF ARUSHA ACCORD.
